Greetings to the Chair of ACCORD, Madame Graça Machel, the Founder and Executive Director of ACCORD, Dr Vasu Gounden, and all our esteemed guests on this significant milestone, the celebration of the 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the founding of ACCORD.

I must first express my sincere apologies for not being able to join you to commemorate, celebrate and acknowledge one of our most outstanding institutions!

The world we live in, the Africa that we fought for so gallantly, the country that we call our home, has never been in such a dire need for strategic partnerships, for collaborations among peace loving individuals, groups and nations; for innovative ideas to address issues of poverty, unemployment, inequality and climate change; for urgent efforts to uplift the standards of living of our people, in particular youth and women, for complimentary efforts to fight instability, respond to natural disasters, and attend to humanitarian emergencies.

I am sure, South Africa, Africa, and the world, will continue to count on ACCORD, as a partner in finding constructive solutions to these and many other challenges.

I congratulate you for having built a formidable institution, for enabling us to celebrate, that out of this continent can emerge an Institution that can stand its own and be counted among global institutions of note in the area of peace, security and dialogue.
